

Although all pregnancies may involve certain risks, a high-risk pregnancy is a pregnancy that entails increased health risks for the pregnant woman, her unborn baby or both.

WHO ARE AT RISK?

- 1. Women with preexisting health conditions such as but not limited to:
 - a. Diabetes
 - b. High blood pressure
 - c. Kidney disease
 - d. Thyroid disease
 - e. Liver disease
 - f. Cancer
 - g. Cardiac disease
 - h. Autoimmune disease
 - Mental health disorders
 - j. Blood clotting disorders
 - k. Obesity
 - I. Abnormalities or tumors in the reproductive tract
 - m. HIV/AIDS
- 2. Women of advanced maternal age: 35 years old and above
- 3. Adolescent / Teen pregnancy: 17 years old and below
- 4. Women who had a prior preterm delivery or other complications in previous pregnancies
- 5. Fetuses found to have the following conditions but not limited to:
 - a. Congenital anomalies
 - b. Genetic defects
 - c. Intrauterine growth restriction
 - d. Multiple gestation

- 1. First trimester screening test:
 - a. Aneuploidy
 - b. Preeclamspia
- 2. First rate diagnostic ultrasound machines:
 - a. Biometry

 - c. Doppler Velocimetry
 - d. Congenital anomaly scan
- 3. Cardiotocogram
- 4. Fetal 2D Echocardiography
- 5. Fetal Therapy
 - a. Medical (transplacental)
 - b. Surgical
- 6. Genetic counselling
- 7. Fetal amniotic fluid diagnostic and therapeutic procedures:
 - a. Amniocentesis
 - b. Amnioreduction
- 8. Preterm Birth Clinic
 - a. Cervical elastography
 - b. Cervical cerclage
 - c. Pessary insertion
 - d. Actim partus
 - e. Actim prom
